FEI World Jumping Finals



Congratulations to Kirista Rabain who secured an impressive 6th place standing at the 2017 FEI World Jumping Challenge Finals held in Alger, Algeria.

After two days of qualifying competitions, Kirista, riding Vitamine Semilly, an 8-

year-old Selle Francais bay mare, successfully qualified for the Final competition.

Although Kirista and Vitamine Semilly had the fastest time in the final jump off, they incurred 8 penalties. Winning the 2017 FEI World Jumping Finals was India's Nitin Gupta riding Aladen Des Forets with a 3 penalties in a time of 50.20.

Bermuda Wins the 2017 PAEC Caribbean Junior Jumping Challenge



As reported in the local Royal Gazette newspaper, Bermuda celebrated "double joy" at the 2017 PAEC Caribbean Junior Jumping Challenge with Kelsey Amos and Casey Truran winning the *Team Event* & Casey Truran winning the *Overall Individual* prize.

The Challenge was held at the beautiful Ronald C. Waranch Equestrian Center, located at the Savannah College of Art and Design. (SCAD). Riding borrowed horses, riders competed over a designated two-phase course using faults and closest to optimum time to determine results. Points were awarded for each respective place and the combined scores from both divisions determined the final team country total.

After the first day of competition, Bermuda stood in 4th place; trailing the leaders by 7 points. However, on the final day, Casey successfully jumped clear and proceeded on to a very exciting jump-off phase where he was .08seconds within the optimum time of 30 seconds. This put

Casey in 1st place and Kelsey in 7th place. Their combined scores resulted in Bermuda proudly winning the team competition and Casey Truran winning the overall individual award. Other countries competing in the event included, Antigua, Barbados, Jamaica, USA, Trinidad and Tobago.

The Bermuda Dressage Group's junior members, Kelsey Amos and Robin Stempel recently returned from competing in the 2017 Lendon's Youth Dressage Festival held in Saugerties New York. The comprised competition three divisions, the written test, an equitation

class and the dressage test. Each part was weighted equally and competitors were required to participate in all sections. Kelsey and Robin performed extremely well in each of the divisions and their commendable results are as follows:

Robin Stempel riding Queen's Faithfully

Dressage Test – First Level, Test 2 (15-16 years): 65.156% earning Robin a 2nd place.

Equitation: 86% Written Test: 88%

Kelsey Amos riding Weltino HW

Dressage Tests 65.781 First Level Test 2 (11-14 years) Placed 4th also 68.5% in the FEI Children Test earning Kelsey a 2nd place.

Equitation: 91% Written Test: 82%

Kelsey was also presented with the *Russells Mills Memorial Trophy* for the highest score in the equitation division and the *Later On Memorial*

Trophy for the highest scoring rider travelling a long distance and competing on a borrow horse.

It was an exciting summer for Junior BEF member Casey Truran; this year's recipient of Bermuda Government Sports Grant. Casey travelled to Europe to spend three weeks in an intensive training program with Bermuda's Patrick Nisbett. Casey also gained valuable experience by competing

in numerous show Jumping events throughout Europe.

Indeed, riding the bay mare Echarme C, (owned Veronique by Van Rooshroeck) Casey jumped to 1st place in the 1.15m international jumping competition presented by Cavalleria The class attracted in excess Toscana. of 40 entries representing Europe, United Kingdom, Middle East, USA and Canada. Only six riders qualified for the jump off round. Casey and Echarme C incurred no penalties in a time of 41.70 seconds thus securing the trophy. It was indeed a very proud moment as the Bermuda Flag was raised and "Hail to Bermuda" was played.

When not competing at shows, Kiwon was given the opportunity to drive at least five of Silver Shoe Farm's carriage horses on a daily basis. Kiwon also received first hand training in shoeing from Mr. Raymond Cable, a well-known USA farrier with some 60 years of experience.

With professional guidance from Nicole Cable, Kiwon committed himself to the daily training and bonding with the horse - a challenging project that Kiwon eagerly tackled.
