RULES

1. For BEF designated classes, all horses and ponies must be registered with, and competitors must be members of, the BEF prior to the close of entries.
2. Correct money for each class must accompany entry form.
3. The organizing committee reserves the right to change, cancel or combine classes or to deny inappropriate entries, if they have reason to do so.
4. Competitors should be neatly and suitably attired in coat, hunt cap with harness. Refer to BEF Rule Book for further details on dress.
5. - Any cruelty or abuse, whether it is physical, verbal or otherwise, directed at any horse, person, or official of the show, will result in immediate elimination by the organizing committee. Refer to BEF Codes of Conduct.
6. Fences in the warm-up ring must be jumped in the direction indicated by the red & white flags when indicated.
7. No person shall have any contact, direct or indirect, with any part of the fences in the main ring or the warm-up ring, while a horse or pony is jumping. Rapping a horse will result in elimination. No false ground lines may be used.
8. Any situation or condition not covered by the rules of the BEF will be decided by the Show Director.
9. All queries regarding registration of horses & memberships with the BEF are to be directed to Anne Cherry Tel: 505-3815 or email jacherry@northrock.bm
10. To be eligible for a division championship, all classes of the division must be entered at the time of close of entries which in turn must be indicated on the Entry Form. Post entries will be considered to division championships.

11. Withdrawal of entries refer to BEF Rule Book. Any subsequent requests for changes must be directed to the Show Secretary.

12. List of requirements from which a judge may choose for an individual test in equitation classes may be found in the BEF Rule Book.

13. Jumping classes will be held under USEF Zone 1 Rules, not for BEF points

- Ribbons will be awarded to 6th place at each show.

ENTRIES

- Enter the correct horse/pony registration number on the entry form where required as well as the BEF membership number of the rider. The age and date of birth of a junior competitor is also required. Entry forms without this information may not be accepted.
- Post entries will be accepted prior to the start of a class as provided in the BEF Rules.
- The age of a junior competitor will be taken as of September 1, 2018. A junior competitor shall be under 19 years.

CLASS 9A – X-RAIL HUNTER Open

To be shown over no more than eight x-rail fences. Judged on performance and soundness, manners and suitability of pony/horse to rider will be emphasized. 50% horse and 50% rider
Judged Extreme speed is penalized.

CLASS 10A – 2' HUNTER Open

To be shown over a course of not less than eight obstacles. Height of fences not to exceed 2'0". Judged on performance and soundness and suitability of pony/horse to rider will be emphasized. 50% horse and 50% rider judged Extreme speed is penalized

CLASS 8A – #19 LOW HUNTER PONY OVER FENCES

To be shown over a minimum of eight fences not to exceed 2'3". Judged on performance and soundness, and manners and suitability of a pony to rider will be emphasized. Extreme speed is penalized. Ponies may only be shown by junior competitors 18 years and under & stallions are prohibited. Ponies may not cross enter into classes 1a, 1b or 1c.

CLASS 8B - #19 LOW HUNTER HANDY PONY

To be ridden over a course off jumps to consist of no less than 8 fences not to exceed 2'3" in height. Handy Hunter will be judged as per class 8A but requires and in and out combination jump, a trot fence and at least 2 changes of direction. Manners, style of jumping, maneuverability, flow of strides and balance are elements that the judge will also take into consideration when awarding a score. Scores will be announced on completion of each round. Ponies may only be shown by junior competitors 18 years and under & stallions are prohibited. Ponies may not cross enter into classes 1a, 1b or 1c.

CLASS 1A – #06 HUNTER PONY OVER FENCES

To be shown over a minimum of eight fences not to exceed 2'6". Judged on performance and soundness, and manners and suitability of a pony to rider will be emphasized. Extreme speed is penalized. Ponies may only be shown by junior competitors 18 years and under & stallions are prohibited. Ponies may not cross enter into classes 8a, 8b or 8c.

CLASS 1B – #06 HUNTER HANDY PONY

To be ridden over a course off jumps to consist of no less than 8 fences not to exceed 2'3" in height. Handy Hunter will be judged as per class 8A but requires and in and out combination jump, a trot fence and at least 2 changes of direction. Manners, style of jumping, maneuverability, flow of strides and balance are elements that the judge will also take into consideration when awarding a score. Scores will be announced on completion of each round. Ponies may only be shown by junior competitors 18 years and under & stallions are prohibited. Ponies may not cross enter into classes 8a, 8b or 8c.

CLASS 9B – X-RAIL HUNTER Open

Judged on performance and soundness, manners and suitability of pony/horse to rider will be emphasized. Extreme speed is penalized. Walk , trot

CLASS 10B – 2' HUNTER UNDER SADDLE, Open

Judged on performance and soundness, manners and suitability of pony/horse to rider will be emphasized. Extreme speed is penalized. Walk, trot and canter

CLASS 8C – #19 LOW HUNTER PONY, UNDER SADDLE

To be shown at a walk, trot, canter and hand gallop. Riders may be asked for a sitting trot and an extended trot. Ponies to stop easily, to back readily and stand quietly. Light contact with pony's mouth is required. To be judged on performance and soundness. Manners and suitability of a pony to rider will be emphasized. Extreme speed is penalized. Ponies may only be shown by junior competitors 18 years and under & stallions are prohibited. Ponies may not cross enter into classes 1a, 1b or 1c.

CLASS 1C – #06 HUNTER PONY UNDER SADDLE

To be shown at a walk, trot, canter and hand gallop. Riders may be asked for a sitting trot and an extended trot. Ponies to stop easily, to back readily and stand quietly. Light contact with pony's mouth is required. To be judged on performance and soundness. Manners and suitability of a pony to rider will be emphasized. Extreme speed is penalized. Ponies may only be shown by junior competitors 18 years and under & stallions are prohibited. Ponies may not cross enter into classes 8a, 8b or 8c.

CLASS 26 – OPEN WALK TROT CLASS Horses or ponies to be ridden by adults or children to be shown under English saddle at a flat-footed walk with reasonably loose rein, trot, polo shirts, helmet, and boots required Rider may not enter class 26a

CLASS 27– OPEN WALK TROT CANTER CLASS Horses or ponies to be ridden by adults or children to be shown under English saddle at a flat-footed walk with reasonably loose rein, trot, and canter polo shirts, helmet, and boots required

CLASS 4A – #08 WALK & TROT EQUITATION 10 YEARS & UNDER

Competitors must not have reached their eleventh (11) birthday by September 1st of the current B.E.F. Show Season. To be judged at a walk and trot only. The ability of the rider only to be judged. Any horse, serviceably sound, that is suitable for riding, and is capable of performing required class routine, is acceptable. Stallions are prohibited. May be asked to perform Test 1 of the B.E.F. Equitation Rules Part III.

CLASS 3A – #07 LEAD LINE EQUITATION UNDER 8 YEARS

Open to junior competitors who will not have reached their eighth (8) birthday by September 1st of the current B.E.F. Show Season. To be judged at a walk and trot only, with the ability of the rider only to be judged. Any horse, serviceably sound, that is suitable for riding, and is capable of performing required class routine, is acceptable. Stallions are prohibited. May be asked to perform Test 1 of the B.E.F. Equitation Rules Part III. To be judged at a walk and trot only. The ability of the rider only to be judged. May not enter any other BEF rated equitation class at this show.

CLASS 3B – #07 LEAD LINE EQUITATION UNDER 8 YEARS

Open to junior competitors who will not have reached their eighth (8) birthday by September 1st of the current B.E.F. Show Season. To be judged at a walk and trot only, with the ability of the rider only to be judged. Any horse, serviceably sound, that is suitable for riding, and is capable of performing required class routine, is acceptable. Stallions are prohibited. May be asked to perform Test 1 of the B.E.F. Equitation Rules Part III. To be judged at a walk and trot only. The ability of the rider only to be judged. May not enter any other BEF rated equitation class at this show.

CLASS 4B – #08 WALK & TROT EQUITATION 10 YEARS & UNDER

Competitors must not have reached their eleventh (11) birthday by September 1st of the current B.E.F. Show Season. To be judged at a walk and trot only. The ability of the rider only to be judged. Any horse, serviceably sound, that is suitable for riding, and is capable of performing required class routine, is acceptable. Stallions are prohibited. May be asked to perform Test 1 of the B.E.F. Equitation Rules Part III. May not enter any other BEF rated equitation class at this show

CLASS 28– OPEN WALK TROT CANTER CLASS RIDING SCHOOL KIDS Horses or ponies to be ridden by adults or children to be shown under English saddle at a flat-footed walk with reasonably loose rein, trot, and canter polo shirts, helmet, and boots required. This class could have one mount with different riders and it will be separated according

CLASS 29– OPEN WALK TROT CLASS FOR RIDING SCHOOL KIDS Horses or ponies to be ridden by adults or children to be shown under English saddle at a flat-footed walk with reasonably loose rein, trot, and canter polo shirts, helmet, and boots required. This class could have one mount with different riders and it will be separated according

CLASS 30 – Open Poles

Judged on performance and soundness, manners and suitability of pony/horse to rider will be emphasized. 50% horse and 50% rider Judged, Extreme speed is penalized. Walk , trot. no more than 6 poles

CLASS 14A – #15 LOW HUNTER HORSE OVER FENCES 2'9"

To be shown over a minimum of eight fences not to exceed 2'9". To be judged on performance, soundness, manners and suitability. May not cross enter into any other BEF designated hunter class at this show.

CLASS 14B – #15 LOW HUNTER HANDY HORSE OVER FENCES

To be ridden over a course off jumps to consist of no less than 8 fences not to exceed 2'9" in height. Handy Hunter will be judged as per class 14A but the course requires and in and out combination jump, a trot fence and at least 2 changes of direction. Manners, style of jumping, maneuverability, flow of strides and balance are elements that the judge will also take into consideration when awarding a score. Scores will be announced on completion of each round. May not enter any other class of any other hunter division in this show.

CLASS 2A – #04 JUNIOR HUNTER HORSE OVER FENCES

To be shown over a minimum of eight fences not to exceed 3'0". To be judged on performance, soundness, manners and suitability.

CLASS 2B – #04 JUNIOR HUNTER HANDY HORSE OVER FENCES

To be ridden over a course off jumps to consist of no less than 8 fences not to exceed 3'0" in height. Handy Hunter will be judged as per class 2A but the course requires and in and out combination jump, a trot fence and at least 2 changes of direction. Manners, style of jumping, maneuverability, flow of strides and balance are elements that the judge will also take into consideration when awarding a score. Scores will be announced on completion of each round.

CLASS 11A – #14 WORKING HUNTER HORSE OVER, OVER FENCES

To be shown over a course of not less than eight obstacles. Height of fences not to exceed 3'3". To be judged on performance, soundness, conformation, suitability and manners.

CLASS 11B – #14 WORKING HANDY HORSE OVER, OVER FENCES

To be ridden over a course off jumps to consist of no less than 8 fences not to exceed 3'3" in height. Handy Hunter will be judged as per class 2A but the course requires and in and out combination jump, a trot fence and at least 2 changes of direction. Manners, style of jumping, maneuverability, flow of strides and balance are elements that the judge will also take into consideration when awarding a score. Scores will be announced on completion of each round.

CLASS 14C – #15 LOW HUNTER HORSE UNDER SADDLE

To be shown at a walk, trot and canter both ways of the ring. Light contact with the horse's mouth is required. Horses should be obedient, alert, responsive and move freely. They should not be eliminated for slight errors. May not enter any other BEF designated class of any other hunter division in this show.

CLASS 2C – #04 JUNIOR HUNTER HORSE UNDER SADDLE

To be shown at a walk, trot and canter both ways of the ring. Light contact with the horse's mouth is required. Horses should be obedient, alert, and responsive and move freely. They should not be eliminated for slight errors. Judge *may* ask horses to hand gallop collectively, one way of the ring. No more than eight will be asked to hand gallop at one time. To be judged on performance, soundness, conformation, suitability and manners.

CLASS 11C – #14 WORKING HUNTER HORSE, UNDER SADDLE

To be shown at a walk, trot and canter both ways of the ring. Light contact with the horse's mouth is required. Horses should be obedient, alert, and responsive and move freely. They should not be eliminated for slight errors. Judge *may* ask horses to hand gallop collectively, one way of the ring. No more than eight will be asked to hand gallop at one time. To be judged on performance, soundness, conformation, suitability and manners.

CLASS 13 – 2'3" PUDDLE JUMPER, OPEN

Table II sec 2(a) The first round and first jump off, if any, are decided by adding together the faults incurred over the course and any penalties for exceeding the time Allowed. In the event of equality of faults after the first round there will be one jump-off for first place only in which time will decide the event equality of faults

CLASS 6A – #09 JUNIOR EQUITATION UNDER 12 YEARS OVER FENCES

Competitors must have reached the required age grouping by September 1st of the current B.E.F. Show Season. Jumps cannot exceed 2'3" and wings must be at least 30" wide. The performance begins when the horse enters the ring. Except for refusals, jumping faults of the horse are not to be considered unless it is the result of the rider's ability. Stallions are prohibited. May not enter any other BEF rated equitation class at this show.

CLASS 17A – #27 SHORT STIRRUP EQUITATION 12 YEARS & UNDER OVER FENCES

Open to Junior competitors who will not have reached their thirteenth birthday by September 1st of the current BEF season. To be shown over a simple course of no more than eight fences not to exceed 2'6" in height. The performance begins when the horse enters the ring. Except for refusals, jumping faults of the horse are not to be considered unless it is the result of the rider's ability. Stallions are prohibited. May not enter any other BEF rated equitation at this show.

CLASS 18 – PONY JUMPING

Height of fences not to exceed 0.75m (2'6").

Table II sec 2(a) The first round and first jump off, if any, are decided by adding together the faults incurred over the course and any penalties for exceeding the time Allowed. In the event of equality of faults after the first round there will be one jump-off for first place only in which time will decide the event equality of faults

5A – #10 JUNIOR EQUITATION 12-14 YEARS OVER FENCES

Competitors must have reached the required age grouping by September 1st of the current B.E.F. Show Season. Jumps cannot exceed 2'9" and wings must be at least 30" wide. The performance begins when the horse enters the ring. Except for refusals, jumping faults of the horse are not to be considered unless it is the result of the rider's ability. Stallions are prohibited. May not enter any other BEF rated equitation at this show.

CLASS 7A – #11 JUNIOR EQUITATION 15-18 YEARS OVER FENCES

Competitors must have reached the required age grouping by September 1st of the current B.E.F. Show Season. Jumps cannot exceed 3'0". The ability of the rider only to be judged. The performance begins when the horse enters the ring. Except for refusals, jumping faults of the horse are not to be considered unless it is the result of the rider's ability. Stallions are prohibited.

CLASS 19 – HORSE & PONY JUMPING 2'9" TO 3'0", OPEN

Table II sec 2(a) The first round and first jump off, if any, are decided by adding together the faults incurred over the course and any penalties for exceeding the time Allowed. In the event of equality of faults after the first round there will be one jump-off for first place only in which time will decide the event equality of faults

CLASS 15A – #12 ADULT EQUITATION OVER FENCES 3'0"

Open to adults 19 years or older. Height of fences not to exceed 3'0". The performance begins when the horse enters the ring. Except for refusals, jumping faults of the horse are not to be considered unless it is the result of the rider's ability. To be shown over a course of not less than eight (8) obstacles. The course must include one combination which includes an oxer and two change of direction after the first obstacle

CLASS 15B – #12 ADULT EQUITATION

To be judged at a walk, trot and canter both ways of the ring. Entries may be asked to change mounts and/or to do an individual show. May be asked to perform Tests 1-18 of the B.E.F. Rules Part III. Two or more tests of the top four competitors is encouraged.

CLASS 16 – ADULT LEAD LINE

To be judged at a walk and trot only, with the ability of the rider only to be judged. Stallions are prohibited. Will not be asked to change mounts or do an individual show.

CLASS 7B – #11 JUNIOR EQUITATION 15-18 YEARS

To be judged at a walk, trot and center both ways of the ring. To be judged at a walk, trot and canter both ways of the ring. Entries may be asked to change mounts and/or to do an individual show. Stallions are prohibited. May be asked to perform Tests 1-18 of the B.E.F. Rules Part III.

CLASS 5B – #10 JUNIOR EQUITATION 12-14 YEARS

To be judged at a walk, trot and canter both ways of the ring. Entries may be asked to do an individual show. Stallion are prohibited. May be asked to perform Tests 1-8, 10, 11, 13, or 14 of the B.E.F. Rules Part III. May not enter any other BEF designated equitation class at this show.

CLASS 17B – #27 SHORT STIRRUP EQUITATION 12 YEARS & UNDER

To be judged at the Walk, Trot and Canter both ways of the ring. May be asked to perform tests 1,3,4,5,6,8,10 & 11 of the B.E.F. Rules Part III. May not enter any other BEF rated equitation class in a show where this class or division is offered.

CLASS 6B – #09 JUNIOR EQUITATION UNDER 12 YEARS

Competitors must not have reached their twelfth (12) birthday by September 1st of the current B.E.F. Show Season. The ability of the rider only to be judged. Any horse, serviceably sound, that is suitable for riding, and is capable of performing required class routine, is acceptable. Stallions are prohibited. To be judged at a walk, Trot and canter both ways of the ring. May be asked to perform B.E.F. Equitation Tests 1-3-4-5-6-8-10 of the B.E.F. Rules Part III. May not enter any other BEF rated equitation class in a show where this class or division is offered.

CLASS 23 – Rescue Relay Horse or Pony 2'6"-2'9"

Competition is for a Team of two athletes, who must enter the ring together. The course shown on the plan must be completed twice consecutively. The athlete going through the start line must jump the first obstacle, and the athlete jumping the last obstacle must cross the finish line in order to stop the clock. If an athlete crosses the finishing line after the other athlete has jumped the penultimate obstacle, the team is eliminated. The time of the round is taken from the moment the first athlete crosses the starting line until the last member of the team passes the finishing line.

CLASS 20 – HORSE JUMPING AT (3'3") 1.00m

Height of fences not to exceed 1.00m (3'3"). Table II sec 2(a) The first round and first jump off, if any ,are decided by adding together the faults incurred over the course and any penalties for exceeding the time Allowed. in the event of equality of faults after the first round there will be one jump-off for first place only in which time will decide the event equality of faults

CLASS 21 –HORSE JUMPING AT (3'6") 1.10m

Height of fences not to exceed 1.10m (3'6"). Table II sec 2(a) The first round and first jump off, if any ,are decided by adding together the faults incurred over the course and any penalties for exceeding the time Allowed. in the event of equality of faults after the first round there will be one jump-off for first place only in which time will decide the event equality of faults

CLASS 22 – HORSE JUMPING over 1.20m

Height of fences over 1.20m. Table II sec 2(a) The first round and first jump off, if any ,are decided by adding together the faults incurred over the course and any penalties for exceeding the time Allowed. in the event of equality of faults after the first round there will be one jump-off for first place only in which time will decide the event equality of faults

CLASS 24 – Chase me Charlie Open
