The age of a junior competitor will be taken as that on September 1st 2021. A junior competitor shall be under 19 years.

PRIZE LIST

Classes 10, 12 and 26 rosettes will be presented from 1st to 8th place.

All other classes rosettes will be presented from 1st to 6th place

Points will be accumulated for **OVERALL Junior Champion and OVERALL Senior Champion**

DRESS

Competitors should be neatly and suitably attired according to the discipline. Refer to BEF Rule Book for further details on dress.

EQUITATION CLASSES

Only one rider per mount. The ability of the rider only to be judged. Any horse or pony serviceably sound that is suitable for riding, and is capable of performing required class routine, is acceptable. Stallions are prohibited. Test description can be found on page 35 of the BEF Rule Book and they may be performed either collectively or individually. BEF Rule Book www.bef.bm

JUMPING CLASSES:

Jumping classes will be held under modified FEI Rules, with the exception of Puddle Jumping.

PLEASURE DRIVING CLASSES: Apron, hat, whip and gloves are strongly encouraged

SATURDAY 23RD April 2022

Class 1

RIDING HORSES, OPEN

Entries to be shown under English saddle. Horses to enter ring at a walk. To be shown at a walk, trot, strong trot, canter and hand gallop. Only eight horses to gallop at one time. To be judged on performance, conformation, substance and manners. Horses in this class may be any breed or combination of breeds, must have natural action, i.e. not high and/or weighted, and must be over 14.2hh.

Class 2

WESTERN PLEASURE (Open to Horses and Ponies)

The ideal mount will appear to be easy going and a pleasure to ride. To be shown at walk, jog (slow trot), and lope (slow canter) displaying both leads, both ways of the ring. To be shown on a loose rein and judged on performance and manners 60%; type, condition and conformation 30%; appointments 10%. Horses head carriage that is too high or too low should be penalized. Entries to be shown with a stock saddle with or without silver, but silver equipment will not count over a good working outfit. Horses to be shown in standard western shank bit with half-inch flat chain or leather chinstrap using one hand on reins. Although not recommended horses under five can be shown without discrimination with two hands against one handed riders provided they have a standard snaffle bit or bitless hackamore bosal. This applies to horses that have never been shown in a shank bit. Hackamore bits, nosebands, martingales and tie-downs are prohibited. No metal or leather devices in conjunction with or as part of the chinstrap are allowed. Riders must wear western attire, which includes western hat, long sleeve shirt, pants, or jeans under chaps, or western frontier style pants, western boots, and western ties or neckpieces. Western jackets, vests, sweaters, spurs, and rope or reata are optional.

Class 22

ADULT EQUITATION

To be judged at a walk, trot and canter both ways of the ring. Two or more tests of the top four competitors are required. May be asked to perform Tests 1 through 18 of the BEF Equitation Rules.

Class 3

UTILITY HORSE

To be shown at walk, trot and canter both ways of the ring. May be asked to hand gallop and negotiate small obstacles. May be required to jump a small fence. Horses to be judged on performance, way of going suitability to rider, and soundness. Horses will not be penalized for small blemishes. May be shown under English or western tack. All juniors are required to wear hard hat with harness attached.

Class 4

JUNIOR EQUITATION 15 – 18 YEARS

To be judged at a walk, trot and canter both ways of the ring. Entries may be asked to change mounts and/or do an individual show. May be asked to perform Tests 1 through 18 of the BEF Equitation Rules.

Class 5

PLEASURE DRIVING HORSES, SINGLE

Entries to be harnessed to a two- or four-wheeled vehicle capable of carrying a passenger. To be judged on manners and way of going 60%; vehicle and harness, appropriateness, condition 25%; attire and driving 15%; to be shown both ways of the ring at a flat walk, working trot and strong trot. Must stand quietly and back readily.

Class 6

JUNIOR EQUITATION 12 – 14 YEARS

To be judged at a walk, trot and canter both ways of the ring. May be asked to perform Tests 1 through 8 10, 11,13 and 14 of the BEF Equitation Rules. **MAY NOT ENTER ANY OTHER EQUITATION CLASS.**

Class 8

RIDING PONIES

Entries to be shown under English saddle. Ponies to be ridden by junior competitors. To be shown at a walk, trot and canter both ways of the ring. To be judged on performance, conformation, substance, manners and suitability

Class 9

LADIES PLEASURE DRIVING, SINGLE

Open to Adult only. Open to ponies and horses. To be shown harnessed to a carriage at a walk, slow trot, working trot and strong trot, and will be required to back. Judged on manners and performance 60% conformation and appointments 40%. As part of the performance, entries may be required to complete tasks as a group. Errors will incur penalties.

Class 11

OPEN CARRIAGE HORSE, SINGLE

To be shown harnessed to a carriage at a walk, slow trot, working trot and strong trot, and will be required to back. Judged on manners and performance 60% conformation and appointments 40%. As part of the performance, entries may be required to complete tasks as a group. Errors will incur penalties

CLASS 13

HAS BEENS & WANNA BEES DRIVING HORSE or PONY OPEN

Open to Adults who have driven many moons ago or who have never driven. May be lead if needed and dress up is encouraged. Proper dress is encouraged, but not required.

CLASS 14

HAS BEENS & WANNA BEES WALK TROT, OPEN– RIDING HORSE or PONY

Open to Adults who have ridden many moons ago or who have never ridden. Adults may not ride ponies. May be lead if needed and dress up is encouraged. Proper dress is encouraged, but not required. A helmet is mandatory.

Class 15

OPEN CARRIAGE CLASS, DOUBLE

Open to Horses and Ponies, double or tandem. Conditions as for Class 11.

CLASS 16

PUDDLE JUMPING Height not to exceed 0.70m

USEF Optimum Time Competition - Optimum Time in First Round (Table IV Sec. 1) – This competition is decided by adding together the faults incurred over the course and any penalties for exceeding the Time Allowed. In the case of equality of faults, ties will be broken on the following basis: an “Optimum Time” (defined as 4 seconds less than the Time Allowed for the course) will be posted on the course plan; the horse with the time on course closest to this Optimum Time (over or under) will prevail in the tie, next closest next, etc.

Class 17

HORSE JUMPING

(FEI Art 238.2.2). Fences not to exceed 1.00m (3' 3"). Competition against the clock. In the event of equality of penalties for first place, there will be one jump- off against the clock over a shortened course over obstacles, which may be increased in height and/ or spread. Other competitors are placed in accordance to their penalties and time in the first round.

Class 18

HORSE JUMPING

(FEI Art 238.2.2). Fences not to exceed 1.10m (3' 7"). Competition against the clock. In the event of equality of penalties for first place, there will be one jump- off against the clock over a shortened course over obstacles, which may be increased in height and/ or spread. Other competitors are placed in accordance to their penalties and time in the first round.

Class 19

HORSE JUMPING

(FEI Art 238.2.2) Fences not to exceed 1.15m (3'9"). Competition against the clock. In the event of equality of penalties for first place, there will be one jump- off against the clock over a shortened course over obstacles, which may be increased in height and/ or spread. Other competitors are placed in accordance to their penalties and time in the first round.

SUNDAY 24th APRIL 2022

Class 20

PLEASURE DRIVING PONIES, SINGLE – TROTtingBRED

Adult to drive. To be shown to a suitable two or four wheeled vehicle. To be shown at a flat walk, working trot, strong trot or pace. Extreme speed to be penalized. Must stand quietly and back readily. Appropriate harness to suit the vehicle required. Boots are prohibited. To be judged on manner, quality and performance.

Class 7

JUNIOR EQUITATION UNDER 12 YEARS

To be judged at a walk, trot and canter both ways of the ring. May be asked to perform tests 1–3–4–5–6 8–10 of the BEF Equitation Rules. **MAY NOT ENTER ANY OTHER EQUITATION CLASS.**

Class 21

CHILDREN'S PLEASURE DRIVING PONIES, SINGLE – TROTTINGBRED

Junior to Drive. Mares or geldings only. To be harnessed to a two or four-wheeled vehicle. Children under 16 years must carry an adult in the vehicle. To be shown at a walk, and trot or pace, by a junior exhibitor. Must stand quietly while lined up, without assistance from an attendant, and must back readily. To be judged on manners, quality, suitability of pony to driver, performance and appointments.

Class 26

JUNIOR EQUITATION UNDER 8 YEARS – LEAD LINE

To be led by a properly dressed, responsible person, at walk and trot only. May be asked to perform Test 1 of the BEF Equitation Rules. **MAY NOT ENTER ANY OTHER EQUITATION CLASS.**

Class 24

PLEASURE DRIVING PONIES, SINGLE – NON-TROTTINGBRED

Adult to drive. To be shown to a suitable two- or four-wheeled vehicle. To be shown at a flat walk, working trot, strong trot. Extreme speed to be penalized. Must stand quietly and back readily. Appropriate harness to suit the vehicle required. Boots are prohibited. To be judged on manners, quality and performance.

Class 25

CHILDREN'S PLEASURE DRIVING PONIES, SINGLE – NON-TROTTINGBRED

Junior to Drive. Mares or geldings only. To be harnessed to a two- or four-wheeled vehicle. Children under 16 years must carry an adult in the vehicle. To be shown at a walk, and trot, by a junior exhibitor. Must stand quietly, without assistance from an attendant, and must back readily. To be judged on manners, quality, suitability of pony to driver, performance and appointments.

Class 10

JUNIOR EQUITATION 10 YEARS AND UNDER

To be judged at walk and trot only. May be asked to perform Test 1 of the BEF Equitation Rules. **MAY NOT ENTER ANY OTHER EQUITATION CLASS**

Class 27

MINIATURE HORSE, TO DRIVE

Open to miniature horses under 36". Shown harnessed to an appropriate vehicle at a walk and trot. Judged on manners, performance, conformation and appointment.

Class 23

OPEN LEAD LINE

Class 28

RACING PONIES – Pacers/Trotters

Harnessed to sulky or jogging cart. Drivers to wear stable colours. To be shown at a jog, road gait and speed with penalty for breaking gait. Judged on performance, speed, manners, conformation and appointments.

CLASS 12

FANCY DRESS, OPEN – Disney theme

CLASS 29**GAMBLERS CHOICE DRIVING CLASS, HORSES & PONIES,**

For drivers in 4-wheel carriage navigating obstacles each with a point value depending on difficulty with a time allowed and the highest score wins

CLASS 30**GAMBLERS CHOICE DRIVING CLASS, HORSES & PONIES,**

For drivers in 2 Wheeled Vehicle. To be judged as for Class 29.

CLASS 31**PUDDLE JUMPING Height not to exceed 0.80m USEF Optimum Time Competition -**

Optimum Time in First Round (Table IV Sec. 1) – This competition is decided by adding together the faults incurred over the course and any penalties for exceeding the Time Allowed. In the case of equality of faults, ties will be broken on the following basis: an “Optimum Time” (defined as 4 seconds less than the Time Allowed for the course) will be posted on the course plan; the horse with the time on course closest to this Optimum Time (over or under) will prevail in the tie, next closest next, etc.

Class 32**HORSE JUMPING**

(FEI Art 238.2.2). Height of fences not to exceed 1.00m (3’ 3”) Competition against the clock. In the event of equality of penalties for first place, there will be one jump-off against the clock over a shortened course over obstacles, which may be increased in height and/or spread. Other competitors are placed in accordance to their penalties and time in the first round.

Class 33**HORSE JUMPING**

FEI Art 238.2.2. Height of fences not to exceed 1.10m (3’7”). Competition against the clock. In the event of equality of penalties for first place, there will be one jump-off against the clock over a shortened course over obstacles, which may be increased in height and/or spread. Other competitors are placed in accordance to their penalties and time in the first round.

Class 34**OPEN JUMPING COMPETITION (FEI Art. 273.3.2 /4 4). Fences not to exceed 1.15m**

(3’9”). This will consist of a two-round competition, not against the clock but with a time allowed. The second round will be over a shortened and adjusted course of 8 –10 fences. In the event of an equality of faults for first place after the second round, there will be a jump-off. Competitors will be placed according to the penalties and time in the jump off. The remaining competitors will be placed according to the aggregate penalties over both rounds and time of the second round.
