Entries online will be accepted on or before the entry deadline, Those not paying online must deliver their entries and payment to Hinson Hall, Inwood or Breakaway Stables by the entry deadline.

ENTRY FEE - \$20.00 per class

ADMINISTRATION FEE: - \$20 Each Horse

FIELD CREW FEE: - \$10 Each Horse

POST ENTRIES – Not permitted

SUBSTITUTE OF RIDER – Not permitted

NOMINATIONS – Will not be accepted

REFUNDS – 50% refund permitted with a Dr. Certificate or a Veterinarian Certificate

BEF MEMBERSHIP: All entries must be paid up members of the BEF and horses need to have been re- registered with the BEF for 2022/2023.

THE COMPETITION: This challenge will be held under FEI rules and scored under a modified FEI Article 238.2.1. Athletes with equality of penalties for any place are placed in accordance with the time taken to complete the round versus the optimum time as per Equestrian Canada Article G613. In the event of equality of penalties and time, the tie will stand and the tied athletes will be placed equally for that place. No jump-off will take place. For each competition year, the MJC will observe FEI and EC rules effective on January 1st of that year.

EC ARTICLE G613 MATCH THE CLOCK (OPTIMUM TIME) COMPETITION

- i. Match the clock or optimum time classes are designed to help developing riders learn the skill of riding a course at the posted speed, rather than with the fastest time. Competitors with equal faults will be placed according to how close their time is to the optimum time, which is based on the course being ridden at the posted speed.
- ii. Scoring will be under Table A [over one round]. Optimum time should be four (4) seconds less than the time allowed. The course designer will calculate the optimum time based on the posted speed.

Ring Size: 45m x 50m
Speed: 300 m/m for ponies and 325m/m for horses

ROSETTES: Classes will be placed to 6th.

CEA AGE OF COMPETITORS

This competition is open to **competitors of all ages**. Adults can ride ponies. The NF and OC are responsible for assuring the appropriateness of all horse/rider combinations.

CEA ELIGIBILITY OF RIDER: **A rider may only enter and compete in one height class.** The first class entered by a rider will be the only score to go forward to the CEA MJC results. No rider may compete in a non-MJC class on the day of the competition until after their MJC height class is completed. **See MJC Rules for further information.**

CEA ELIGIBILITY OF HORSE: A horse or pony may enter as many as **three (3)** rounds total (at any height) at each MJC event. Scores from the first three rounds of a horse or pony will go forward to the CEA MJC results. A horse competing the MJC may enter a non-MJC class on the day of the competition but can only compete for CEA scores in their first three rounds in the competition arena. **See MJC Rules for further information.**

CEA DRESS & SADDLERY: Please refer to the FEI Jumping Rules for all rules on saddlery. Rules of dress will allow polo shirts that are tucked in. Approved headgear must be worn. Closed-in shoes with small heel may be used if no riding boots are available.

**ENTRIES AS FOLLOWS
in the order of this competition**

CLASS A – CEA MINI JUMPING CHALLENGE

Height of Fences 0.50m; 0.60m wide (maximum)

To be judged as described in the CEA MJC Official Rules of this Competition

CLASS B – CEA MINI JUMPING CHALLENGE

Height of fences 0.60m; 0.70m wide (maximum)

To be judged as described in the CEA MJC Official Rules of this Competition

CLASS C – CEA MINI JUMPING CHALLENGE

Height of fences 0.70m high; 0.80m wide (maximum)

To be judged as described in the CEA MJC Official Rules of this Competition
