BEF MEMBERSHIP: All entrants must be paid up members of the BEF and horses must have been reregistered with the BEF for <u>2023/2024</u>.

THE COMPETITION: This challenge will be held under FEI rules and scored under a modified FEI Article 238.2.1. Athletes with equality of penalties for any place are placed in accordance with the time taken to complete the round versus the optimum time as per Equestrian Canada Article G613. In the event of equality of penalties and time, the tie will stand and the tied athletes will be placed equally for that place. No jump-off will take place. For each competition year, the MJC will observe FEI and EC rules effective on January 1st of that year.

EC ARTICLE G613 MATCH THE CLOCK (OPTIMUM TIME) COMPETITION

- i. Match the clock or optimum time classes are designed to help developing riders learn the skill of riding a course at the posted speed, rather than with the fastest time. Competitors with equal faults will be placed according to how close their time is to the optimum time, which is based on the course being ridden at the posted speed.
- ii. Scoring will be under Table A [over one round]. Optimum time should be four (4) seconds less than the time allowed. The course designer will calculate the optimum time based on the posted speed.

ROSETTES: Classes will be placed to 6th.

CEA AGE OF COMPETITORS

This competition is open to **competitors of all ages**. Adults can ride ponies. The NF and OC are responsible for <u>assuring the appropriateness of all horse/rider combinations</u>.

CEA ELIGIBILITY OF RIDER: A rider may only enter and compete in one height class for CEA MJC results (but they can compete in more than one height for local competition points). The <u>first</u> class entered by a rider on the day of competition will be the only score to go forward to the CEA MJC results. No rider may compete in a non-MJC class on the day of the competition until after their MJC height class is completed.

CEA ELIGIBILITY OF HORSE: <u>A horse or pony may enter as many as **three (3)** rounds</u> total (at any height) at each MJC event. Scores from the first three rounds of a horse or pony will go forward to the CEA MJC results. A horse competing the MJC may enter a non-MJC class on the day of the competition but can only compete for CEA scores in their first three rounds in the competition arena.

CEA DRESS & SADDLERY: Please refer to the FEI Jumping Rules for all rules on saddlery. Properly fitting and fastened headgear must be worn. Rules of dress require light colored breeches or jodphurs with boots. Show shirts or collared shirts or polo shirts are allowed if they are white, buttoned up, and tucked in with a belt. Jackets should be available but can be waived on the day of the show by the Ground Jury.

The order of this competition:

8.30 am - CLASS A - Height of fences 0.50m; 0.60m wide (max)

CLASS B – Height of fences 0.60m; 0.70m wide (max)

CLASS C – Height of fences 0.70m; 0.80m wide (max)

Ring Size: 40m x 50m

Speed: 300 m/m for ponies and 325m/m for horses

INDIVIDUAL PLACING: Individual placing will be based on individual rider results across the Caribbean for each height class.

TEAM PLACING: Team placing will be determined based on the best score from each member country in each height class. The time differences versus the optimum times and faults will be added together into a combined team score for each member country. For example:
