ENTRIES CLOSE ON TUESDAY 6TH FEBRUARY, 2024

ENTRY FEES: BHPA MEMBER \$25 class / BHPA NON-MEMBER \$30 class

JUMPER ADD BACK \$45 class (for both member & non-member)

POST ENTRIES – Double regular entry fee **SCHOOLING: \$15**

ADMINISTRATION FEE: \$25 for each horse/pony entered in the show

JUMP CREW FEE: \$20 for each horse/pony entered in the show (to cover cost of jump crew and course build)

- Pay online to the BHPA Account: Bank of N.T. Butterfield, Account Number 20-006-060-055546-100. Please REMEMBER to identify the entry you are paying for and put your payment reference where indicated on the entry form.

OR

May be left at Hinson Hall Stables, Inwood Stables or Breakaway Stables in a sealed envelope clearly marked BHPA Entries. Please make cheques payable to BHPA. (Avoid cash if possible).

Enter the correct horse/pony registration number on the entry form where required as well as the BEF membership number of the rider. The age and date of birth of a junior competitor is also required. Entry forms without this information may not be accepted.

REFUNDS - A 50% refund will be given upon receipt of a Dr.'s or Vet Certificate

Post entries will be accepted prior to the first warning call for the particular class.

HORSE SHOW RULES

1. All horses and ponies must be registered with, and competitors must be members of, the BEF prior to the close of entries. All queries regarding registration of horses & memberships with the BEF are to be directed to Anne Cherry Tel: 505-3815 or email jacherry@northrock.bm
2. The age of a junior competitor will be taken as of September 1, 2022. A junior competitor shall be under 19 years.
3. The organizing committee reserves the right to change, cancel or combine classes or to deny inappropriate entries, if they have reason to do so.
4. Competitors should be neatly and suitably attired in coat, hunt cap with harness. Refer to BEF Rule Book for further details on dress.
5. Any cruelty or abuse, whether it is physical, verbal or otherwise, directed at any horse, person, or show official, will result in immediate elimination of the entry concerned.
6. No person shall have any contact, direct or indirect, with any part of the fences in the main ring or the warm-up ring, while a horse or pony is jumping. Rapping a horse will result in elimination. No false ground lines may be used.
7. Substitutions are allowed as follows: In equitation classes, where only the rider is judged, the mount may be changed up until the class is called. In all other classes, riders may be substituted without post entry charges. A new rider in an equitation class is a post entry; and a new horse/pony in any other class is a post entry. All requests for changes must be directed to the Show Secretary.
8. List of requirements from which a judge may choose for an individual test in equitation classes may be found in the BEF Rule Book.
9. Any situation or condition not covered by the rules of the BEF will be decided by the Show Director.
- 10. All classes will be run under USEF Jumper rules.**

CLASS DESCRIPTIONS

Table II, Section 2 (a)

Table II, Sec. 2 (a)—The first round and first jump-off, if any, are decided by adding together the faults incurred over the course and any penalties for exceeding the Time Allowed. In the event of equality of faults after the first round, there will be one jump-off for first place only in which time will decide in the event of equality of faults.

Table II, Sec. 2 (a/b)

Table II, Sec. 2 (a/b)—Each exhibitor has the option of taking part in the jump-off at the completion of their round as in 2(b), or after all exhibitors have completed the first round as in 2(a). If there are no clear rounds and a tie exists for first place, a jump-off will be held with those tied for first place.

Table II, Sec. 2 (b)

Table II, Sec. 2 (b)—The first round and first jump-off, if any, are decided by adding together the faults incurred over the course and any penalties for exceeding the Time Allowed. If a competitor has gone clear in the first round, the competitor will, without leaving the ring, upon an audible signal, commence the designated jump-off course. A competitor with a clear round may dismount, and with assistance if necessary, adjust tack and/or equipment; however, upon the audible signal to begin their round, the competitor is responsible to adhering to the 45 seconds rule as per JP137.3.

Class 16 – High Childrens/Adult Classic 0.95 m

To be run under above Jumper **Table II, Sec. 2 (b)** rules. Please see USEF Jumper rulebook for further information. To be eligible, horse must have entered at least one other Childrens/Adult jumper class at the same show.

Class 17 – Modified Children/Adult Classic 1.05 m

To be run under above Jumper **Table II, Sec. 2 (b)** rules. Please see USEF Jumper rulebook for further information. To be eligible, horse must have entered at least one other Childrens/Adult jumper class at the same show. *Course may include Open Water Jump.*

Equitation Medal Classes

Class 18 –Jumper Seat Medal 0.85 m

Open to all competitors. See below description.

Class 19 –Jumper Seat Medal 0.95 m

Open to all competitors. See below description.

Jumper Seat Medal Class Description

A. Jumping Seat Medal is a two phase competition open to all competitors with each phase to count 50% and shall be judged on the rider's equitation style, technical merit, judgment and execution of an efficient, time saving pace and track.

B. Two cumulative refusals will incur elimination.

C. One (1) point will be subtracted from the rider's score for each commenced second over the time allowed and four (4) points will be deducted for each knockdown on course. JP137 (The competition round) and JP138 (Timing) will apply.

D. If as a result of a disobedience, a competitor displaces or knocks down any obstacle or in all cases where the nature of the obstacle is changed by a knock down, the tone is sounded and the time is stopped until the obstacle has been rebuilt. When the obstacle has been rebuilt, the tone is sounded to indicate that the course is ready and that the competitor can continue the round. The competitor is penalized for a refusal. The time is restarted at the moment when the horse leaves the ground at the obstacle where the refusal occurred. Judges are asked to walk the course when possible.

E. A minimum of three (3) riders and a maximum of twelve (12) riders (if available) will return for a flat phase. Riders to be judged on position, seat and the correctness and effectiveness of the aids. Excellence and effectiveness on the flat will be rewarded. The performance begins when the class is called to order. Riders will show in both directions as a group at the working walk, the working trot sitting, and the working trot rising, as well as showing a lengthening of stride; the working canter, and the working canter showing a lengthening of stride. All riders shall be required to show at the working canter on the counter lead in each direction. Judges may require any additional tests on the flat (see EQ113). In addition, basic dressage movements may be tested including but not limited to Shoulder-in, Shoulder-out, Haunches-in, and Haunches-out.

F. Riders must compete on the same horse for all phases; no horse substitutions allowed.

The Jumping phase of the class shall be held prior to the Flat phase over a Jumper style course with a minimum of ten numbered fences at the respective height and spread.

Class 20 – Equitation Seat Medal (A) 0.70 m (B) 1.00 m (C) 1.10 m

A. Equitation Seat Medal is a two phase competition open to all competitors with each phase to count 50% and shall be judged on the rider's equitation style, technical merit, judgment and execution of an efficient, time saving pace and track.

B. Two cumulative refusals will incur elimination.

C. A minimum of three (3) riders and a maximum of twelve (12) riders (if available) will return for a flat phase. Riders to be judged on position, seat and the correctness and effectiveness of the aids. Excellence and effectiveness on the flat will be rewarded. The

performance begins when the class is called to order. Riders will show in both directions as a group at the working walk, the working trot sitting, and the working trot rising, as well as showing a lengthening of stride; the working canter, and the working canter showing a lengthening of stride. All riders shall be required to show at the working canter on the counter lead in each direction. Judges may require any additional tests on the flat (see BEF Equitation Tests 1-18). In addition, basic dressage movements may be tested including but not limited to Shoulder-in, Shoulder-out, Haunches-in, and Haunches-out.

D. Riders must compete on the same horse for all phases; no horse substitutions allowed.

E. The Jumping phase of the class shall be held prior to the Flat phase over a Jumper style course with a minimum of ten numbered fences at the respective height and spread and may include Open Water Jump.

Miscellaneous Sunday Class

Class 21 – Jumper Add Back 1.15 – 1.25 m

To be run under above Jumper **Table II, Sec. 2 (a)** rules. *Course may include Open Water Jump.* This is a competition for Prize Money open to horses only which may be ridden by adults or juniors. **Entry fee is \$45** and \$15 from each entry will go into the winnings purse. The top THREE placings will win a proportion of the purse as follows:

1st – 45% 2nd – 25% 3rd – 20%
