If paying online you must identify yourself with your payment by horse name, you must also indicate the amount paid and confirmation number on your entry form.

RULES

1. For BEF designated classes, all horses and ponies must be registered with, and competitors must be members of, the BEF prior to the close of entries.
2. Correct money for each class must accompany entry form.
3. The organizing committee reserves the right to change, cancel or combine classes or to deny inappropriate entries if they have reason to do so.
4. Competitors should be neatly and suitably attired in coat, hunt cap with harness. Refer to BEF Rule Book for further details on dress.
5. Any cruelty or abuse, whether it is physical, verbal or otherwise, directed at any horse, person, or official of the show, will result in immediate elimination by the organizing committee. Refer to BEF Codes of Conduct.
6. Fences in the warm-up ring must be jumped in the direction indicated by the red & white flags when indicated.
7. No person shall have any contact, direct or indirect, with any part of the fences in the main ring or the warm-up ring, while a horse or pony is jumping. Rapping a horse will result in elimination. No false ground lines may be used.
8. Any situation or condition not covered by the rules of the BEF will be decided by the Show Director.
9. All queries regarding registration of horses & memberships with the BEF are to be directed to Anne Cherry Tel: 505-3815 or email jacherry@northrock.bm

10. To be eligible for a division championship, all classes of the division must be entered at the time of close of entries which in turn must be indicated on the Entry Form. Post entries will be considered for division championships but there will be an additional fee of \$10 plus the charge for the Post Entry.

11. Withdrawal of entries refer to BEF Rule Book. Any subsequent requests for changes must be directed to the Show Secretary.

12. List of requirements from which a judge may choose for an individual test in equitation classes may be found in the BEF Rule Book.

13. Jumping classes will be held under USEF Zone 1 Rules, for BEF points.

- A championship and reserve ribbon will be awarded at the end of the third show of the series for each division. Must have entered all three shows to be eligible.
- Division Championships will be determined by the highest number of points awarded to a horse or rider as applicable.
- Division Championships require to riding in both Over fences and under saddle.

ENTRIES

- Enter the correct horse/pony registration number on the entry form where required as well as the BEF membership number of the rider. The age and date of birth of a junior competitor is also required. Entry forms without this information may not be accepted.
- Post entries will be accepted prior to the start of a class as provided in the BEF Rules.
- The age of a junior competitor will be taken as of September 1, 2022. A junior competitor shall be under 19 years.

FEES

CLASS 1 – JUMPING 1.00m (JP5)

Height of fences not to exceed 1.00m. Table II sec 2(a) The first round and first jump off, if any, are decided by adding together the faults incurred over the course and any penalties for exceeding the time Allowed. in the event of equality of faults after the first round there will be one jump-off for first place only in which time will decide the event equality of faults.

CLASS 2 – JUMPING 1.10m (JP6)

Height of fences not to exceed 1.10m. Table II sec 2(a) The first round and first jump off, if any, are decided by adding together the faults incurred over the course and any penalties for exceeding the time Allowed. in the event of equality of faults after the first round there will be one jump-off for first place only in which time will decide the event equality of faults.

CLASS 3 – JUMPING 1.20m(JP7)

Height of fences not to exceed 1.20m. Table II sec 2(a) The first round and first jump off, if any, are decided by adding together the faults incurred over the course and any penalties for exceeding the time Allowed. in the event of equality of faults after the first round there will be one jump-off for first place only in which time will decide the event equality of faults.

CLASS 4 – JUMPING 1.30m (JP8)

Height of fences over 1.30m. Table II sec 2(a) The first round and first jump off, if any, are decided by adding together the faults incurred over the course and any penalties for exceeding the time Allowed. in the event of equality of faults after the first round there will be one jump-off for first place only in which time will decide the event equality of faults.

CLASS 5 – EQUITATION UP TO 1 METER OVER FENCES (EQ6)

Open to adults 19 years or older. Height of fences not to exceed 1M. The performance begins when the horse enters the ring. Except for refusals, jumping faults of the horse are not to be considered unless it is the result of the rider's ability. To be shown over a course of not less than eight (8) obstacles. The course must include one combination which includes an oxer and two changes of direction after the first obstacle.

CLASS 6 – EQUITATION OVER 1 METER OVER FENCES (EQ7)

Open to adults 19 years or older. Height of fences not to exceed 1.05M. The performance begins when the horse enters the ring. Except for refusals, jumping faults of the horse are not to be considered unless it is the result of the rider's ability. To be shown over a course of not less than eight (8) obstacles. The course must include one combination which includes an oxer and two change of direction after the first obstacle May not enter any other BEF rated equitation class at this show unless don't want to be considered for end of year championship.

CLASS 7 – EQUITATION UP TO 1 METER UNDER SADDLE (EQ6)

To be judged at a walk, trot and canter both ways of the ring. Entries may be asked to change mounts and/or to do an individual show. May be asked to perform Tests 1-18 of the B.E.F. Rules Part III. Two or more tests of the top four competitors is encouraged. May not enter any other BEF Equitation rated class at this show unless don't want to be considered for end of year championship.

CLASS 8 – EQUITATION OVER 1METER UNDER SADDLE (EQ7)

To be judged at a walk, trot and canter both ways of the ring. Entries may be asked to change mounts and/or to do an individual show. May be asked to perform Tests 1-18 of the B.E.F. Rules Part III. Two or more tests of the top four competitors is encouraged. May not enter any other BEF rated Equitation class at this show unless don't want to be considered for end of year championship.

SCHOOLING B 0.60M

THIS IS A JUDGED SCHOOLING. You will enter the ring and complete the course in a normal matter and then exit the ring. You will be judged and receive a score. If you need further schooling opportunities, you may obtain another schooling ticket from the show secretary and school again. No coaches will be permitted in the schooling rounds. Payment in advance or on the Field. Tickets to be purchased, prior to schooling from the Announcer's Booth. @ \$20 per round.

CLASS 9 – JUMPER .60 METERS NO COMBINATION (JP2)

Table II sec 2(a) The first round and first jump off, if any, are decided by adding together the faults incurred over the course and any penalties for exceeding the time Allowed. in the event of equality of faults after the first round there will be one jump-off for first place only in which time will decide the event equality of faults.

CLASS 10 – EQUITATION UP TO .70 METERS OVER FENCES (EQ3)

Jumps cannot exceed .70M and wings must be at least 30" wide. The performance begins when the horse enters the ring. Except for refusals, jumping faults of the horse are not to be considered unless it is the result of the rider's ability. Stallions are prohibited to be ridden by juniors. May not enter any other BEF rated equitation class at this show unless don't want to be considered for end of year championship.

CLASS 11 – JUMPER .80 METERS NO COMBINATION (JP3)

Table II sec 2(a) The first round and first jump off, if any, are decided by adding together the faults incurred over the course and any penalties for

exceeding the time Allowed. in the event of equality of faults after the first round there will be one jump-off for first place only in which time will decide the event equality of faults.

CLASS 12 – EQUITATION UP TO .80 METERS OVER FENCES (EQ4)

Jumps cannot exceed .80M and wings must be at least 30" wide. The performance begins when the horse enters the ring. Except for refusals, jumping faults of the horse are not to be considered unless it is the result of the rider's ability. Stallions are prohibited to be ridden by juniors. May not enter any other BEF rated equitation class at this show unless don't want to be considered for end of year championship.

CLASS 13 – JUMPER .90 METERS NO COMBINATION (JP4)

Table II sec 2(a) The first round and first jump off, if any ,are decided by adding together the faults incurred over the course and any penalties for exceeding the time Allowed. in the event of equality of faults after the first round there will be one jump-off for first place only in which time will decide the event equality of faults.

CLASS 14 – EQUITATION UP TO .90 METERS OVER FENCES (EQ5)

Jumps cannot exceed .90M and wings must be at least 30" wide. The performance begins when the horse enters the ring. Except for refusals, jumping faults of the horse are not to be considered unless it is the result of the rider's ability. Stallions are prohibited to be ridden by juniors. May not enter any other BEF rated equitation class at this show unless don't want to be considered for end of year championship.

CLASS 15 – EQUITATION UP TO .70M UNDER SADDLE (EQ3)

The ability of the rider only to be judged. Any horse, serviceably sound, that is suitable for riding, and is capable of performing required class routine, is acceptable. Stallions are prohibited. To be judged at a walk, Trot and canter both ways of the ring. May be asked to perform B.E.F. Equitation Tests 1,3-6,8,10. of the B.E.F. Rules Part III. May not enter any other BEF rated equitation class at this show unless don't want to be considered for end of year championship.

CLASS 16 – EQUITATION UP TO .80M UNDER SADDLE (EQ4)

The ability of the rider only to be judged. Any horse, serviceably sound, that is suitable for riding, and is capable of performing required class routine, is acceptable. Stallions are prohibited. To be judged at a walk, Trot and canter both ways of the ring. May be asked to perform B.E.F. Equitation Tests 1,3-6,8,10 of the B.E.F. Rules Part III. May not enter any other BEF rated equitation class at this show unless don't want to be considered for end of year championship.

CLASS 17– EQUITATION UP TO .90M UNDER SADDLE (EQ5)

The ability of the rider only to be judged. Any horse, serviceably sound, that is suitable for riding, and is capable of performing required class routine, is acceptable. Stallions are prohibited. To be judged at a walk, Trot and canter both ways of the ring. May be asked to perform B.E.F. Equitation Tests 1-8,10,11,13,14. of the B.E.F. Rules Part III. May not enter any other BEF rated equitation class at this show unless don't want to be considered for end of year championship.

SCHOOLING C - POLES/XRAILS

THIS IS A JUDGED SCHOOLING. You will enter the ring and complete the course in a normal matter and then exit the ring. You will be judged and receive a score. If you need further schooling opportunities you may obtain another schooling ticket from the show secretary and school again. No coaches will be permitted in the schooling rounds. Payment in advance or on the Field. Tickets to be purchased, prior to schooling from the Announcer's Booth. @ \$20 per round.

CLASS 18 – LEAD LINE EQUITATION over poles (EQ1)

To be ridden over a course off jumps to consist of no more than 8 fences not to exceed pole in height.. To be judged at a walk and trot only, with the ability of the rider only to be judged. Any horse, serviceably sound, that is suitable for riding, and can perform required class routine, is acceptable. Stallions are prohibited. The ability of the May not enter any other BEF rated equitation class at this show unless don't want to be considered for end of year championship.

CLASS 19 – WALK & TROT EQUITATION over x rails (EQ2)

To be judged at a walk and trot only. The ability of the rider only to be judged. Any horse, serviceably sound, that is suitable for riding, and can perform required class routine, is acceptable. Stallions are prohibited. May not enter any other BEF rated equitation class at this show unless don't want to be considered for end of year championship.

CLASS 20 – LEAD LINE EQUITATION UNDER SADDLE (EQ1)

To be judged at a walk and trot only, with the ability of the rider only to be judged. Any horse, serviceably sound, that is suitable for riding, and can perform required class routine, is acceptable. Stallions are prohibited. May be asked to perform Test 1 of the B.E.F. Equitation Rules Part III. May not enter any other BEF rated equitation class at this show unless don't want to be considered for end of year championship.

CLASS 21 – WALK & TROT EQUITATION UNDER SADDLE (EQ2)

To be judged at a walk and trot only. The ability of the rider only to be judged. Any horse, serviceably sound, that is suitable for riding, and can perform required class routine, is acceptable. Stallions are prohibited. May be asked to perform Test 1 of the B.E.F. Equitation Rules Part III. May not enter any other BEF rated equitation class at this show unless don't want to be considered for end of year championship.

CLASS 22 – HUNTER OVER FENCES OVER 1.00M (HU6)

To be shown over a minimum of eight fences not to exceed 1.05M. To be judged on performance, soundness, manners and suitability. May not cross-enter into any other BEF designated hunter class at this show unless don't want to be considered for end of year championship.

CLASS 23 – HUNTER HANDY OVER FENCES OVER 1.00M (HU6)

To be ridden over a course of jumps to consist of no less than 8 fences not to exceed 1.05M in height. Handy Hunter will be judged as per class 14A, but the course requires an in-and-out combination jump, a trot fence and at least 2 changes of direction. Manners, style of jumping, maneuverability, flow of strides and balance are elements that the judge will also take into consideration when awarding a score. Scores will be announced on completion of each round. May not enter any other class of any other hunter division in this show unless don't want to be considered for end of year championship.

CLASS 24 – HUNTER OVER FENCES UP TO 1.00M (HU5)

To be shown over a minimum of eight fences not to exceed 1.00M. To be judged on performance, soundness, manners, and suitability. May not cross-enter into any other BEF designated hunter class at this show unless don't want to be considered for end of year championship.

CLASS 25 – HUNTER HANDY OVER FENCES UP TO 1.00M (HU5)

To be ridden over a course of jumps to consist of no less than 8 fences not to exceed 1.00M in height. Handy Hunter will be judged as per class 14A, but the course requires an in-and-out combination jump, a trot fence and at least 2 changes of direction. Manners, style of jumping, maneuverability, flow of strides and balance are elements that the judge will also take into consideration when awarding a score. Scores will be announced on completion of each round. May not enter any other class of any other hunter division in this show unless don't want to be considered for end of year championship.

CLASS 26 – HUNTER OVER FENCES UP TO 0.90M (HU4)

To be shown over a minimum of eight fences not to exceed 0.90M. To be judged on performance, soundness, manners, and suitability. May not cross-enter into any other BEF designated hunter class at this show unless don't want to be considered for end of year championship.

CLASS 27 – HUNTER HANDY OVER FENCES UP TO 0.90M (HU4)

To be ridden over a course of jumps to consist of no less than 8 fences not to exceed .90M in height. Handy Hunter will be judged as per class 14A, but the course requires an in-and-out combination jump, a trot fence and at least 2 changes of direction. Manners, style of jumping, maneuverability, flow of strides and balance are elements that the judge will also take into consideration when awarding a score. Scores will be announced on completion of each round. May not enter any other class of any other

hunter division in this show unless don't want to be considered for end of year championship.

CLASS 28 – HUNTER OVER FENCES UP TO 0.80M (HU4)

To be shown over a minimum of eight fences not to exceed 0.80M. To be judged on performance, soundness, manners, and suitability. May not cross-enter into any other BEF designated hunter class at this show unless don't want to be considered for end of year championship.

CLASS 29 – HUNTER HANDY OVER FENCES UP TO 0.80M (HU4)

To be ridden over a course of jumps to consist of no less than 8 fences not to exceed 0.80M in height. Handy Hunter will be judged as per class 14A, but the course requires an in-and-out combination jump, a trot fence and at least 2 changes of direction. Manners, style of jumping, maneuverability, flow of strides and balance are elements that the judge will also take into consideration when awarding a score. Scores will be announced on completion of each round. May not enter any other class of any other hunter division in this show unless don't want to be considered for end of year championship.

CLASS 30 – HUNTER OVER 1.00M, UNDER SADDLE (HU6)

To be shown at a walk, trot and canter both ways of the ring. Light contact with the horse's mouth is required. Horses should be obedient, alert, and responsive and move freely. They should not be eliminated for slight errors. Judge may ask horses to hand gallop collectively, one way of the ring. No more than eight will be asked to hand gallop at one time. To be judged on performance, soundness, conformation, suitability, and manners. May not enter any other class of any other hunter division in this show unless don't want to be considered for end of year championship.

CLASS 31 – HUNTER UP TO 1.00M, UNDER SADDLE (HU5)

To be shown at a walk, trot and canter both ways of the ring. Light contact with the horse's mouth is required. Horses should be obedient, alert, and responsive and move freely. They should not be eliminated for slight errors. Judge may ask horses to hand gallop collectively, one way of the ring. No more than eight will be asked to hand gallop at one time. To be judged on performance, soundness, conformation, suitability, and manners. May not enter any other class of any other hunter division in this show unless don't want to be considered for end of year championship.

CLASS 32 – HUNTER UP TO 0.90M, UNDER SADDLE (HU4)

To be shown at a walk, trot and canter both ways of the ring. Light contact with the horse's mouth is required. Horses should be obedient, alert, and responsive and move freely. They should not be eliminated for slight errors. Judge may ask horses to hand gallop collectively, one way of the ring. No more than eight will be asked to hand gallop at one time. To be judged on performance, soundness, conformation, suitability, and manners. May not enter any other class of any other hunter division in this show unless don't want to be considered for end of year championship.

CLASS 33 – HUNTER UP TO 0.80M, UNDER SADDLE (HU3)

To be shown at a walk, trot and canter both ways of the ring. Light contact with the horse's mouth is required. Horses should be obedient, alert, and responsive and move freely. They should not be eliminated for slight errors.

Judge may ask horses to hand gallop collectively, one way of the ring. No more than eight will be asked to hand gallop at one time. To be judged on performance, soundness, conformation, suitability, and manners. May not enter any other class of any other hunter division in this show unless don't want to be considered for end of year championship.

SCHOOLING E 0.60-0.70M

THIS IS A JUDGED SCHOOLING. You will enter the ring and complete the course in a normal matter and then exit the ring. You will be judged and receive a score. If you need further schooling opportunities you may obtain another schooling ticket from the show secretary and school again. No coaches will be permitted in the schooling rounds. Payment in advance or on the Field. Tickets to be purchased, prior to schooling from the Announcer's Booth. @ \$20 per round.

CLASS 34 – HUNTER OVER FENCES UP TO 0.70M (HU2)

To be shown over a minimum of eight fences not to exceed 0.70M. To be judged on performance, soundness, manners and suitability. May not cross-enter into any other BEF designated hunter class at this show unless don't want to be considered for end of year championship.

CLASS 35 – HUNTER HANDY OVER FENCES UP TO 0.70M (HU2)

To be ridden over a course of jumps to consist of no less than 8 fences not to exceed 0.70M in height. Handy Hunter will be judged as per class 14A, but the course requires an in-and-out combination jump, a trot fence and at least 2 changes of direction. Manners, style of jumping, maneuverability, flow of strides and balance are elements that the judge will also take into consideration when awarding a score. Scores will be announced on completion of each round. May not enter any other class of any other hunter division in this show unless don't want to be considered for end of year championship.

CLASS 36 – HUNTER OVER FENCES UP TO 0.60M WALK TROT (HU1)

To be shown over a minimum of eight fences not to exceed 0.60M. To be judged on performance, soundness, manners and suitability @ the walk and trot. May not cross-enter into any other BEF designated hunter class at this show unless don't want to be considered for end of year championship.

CLASS 37 – HUNTER HANDY OVER FENCES UP TO 0.60M WALK TROT (HU1)

To be ridden over a course of jumps to consist of no less than 8 fences not to exceed 0.60M in height. Handy Hunter will be judged as per class, at least 2 changes of direction @ the walk and trot. Manners, style of jumping, maneuverability, flow of strides and balance are elements that the judge will also take into consideration when awarding a score. Scores will be announced on completion of each round. May not enter any other class of any other hunter division in this show unless don't want to be considered for end of year championship.

CLASS 38– HUNTER UP TO 0.70M, UNDER SADDLE (HU2)

To be shown at a walk, trot and canter both ways of the ring. Light contact with the horse's mouth is required. Horses should be obedient, alert, and responsive and move freely. They should not be eliminated for slight errors.

Judge may ask horses to hand gallop collectively, one way of the ring. No more than eight will be asked to hand gallop at one time. To be judged on performance, soundness, conformation, suitability, and manners. May not enter any other class of any other hunter division in this show unless don't want to be considered for end of year championship.

CLASS 39 –HUNTER, UP TO 0.60M WALK TROT UNDER SADDLE (HU1)

To be shown at a walk, trot. Ponies/horses to stop easily, to back readily and stand quietly. Light contact with pony/horse mouth is required. To be judged on performance and soundness. Manners and suitability of a pony/horse to rider will be emphasized. Extreme speed is penalized.

CLASS 40 - RES MAJOR LEAGUE

- This class is a jumping team competition.
- Each team consists of 3 riders who are to be nominated prior to the close of entries for each show. Team members may be changed and substituted throughout the series, but each rider can only ride for one team over all three competitions.
- Each team must have a rider from each of the following divisions and must declare which division they will be competing in on the entry form:

Division A riders can be taken from JP2/JP3

Division B riders can be taken from JP4/JP5

Division C riders can be taken from JP6/JP7

- Results will be taken from the first round of each division (jump off results will not be considered).
- Faults for each rider will be accumulated after each leg. Bronze, Silver and Gold will be awarded at each competition.
- At the end of the 3 shows, the top 8 teams will qualify for the Major League Finals. These finals will be held on April 14th and will take the following format:
 - Each rider from each team will jump at their declared height and total faults will be accumulated.
 - The 4 teams with the fewest faults will proceed to round 2 (if there is an equality of faults this will be determined by the lowest combined group time).
 - In round 2 the A and B riders will jump on behalf of the team. The top 2 teams with the fewest faults will proceed to the final round (if there is an equality of faults this will be determined by the lowest combined group time).
 - The reserved C riders from the top 2 teams move forwards to the final jump off. The rider with the fewest faults wins (if there
